- The first ever comprehensive collection of music written by Britten, working with WH Auden, for 1930's information films made by the GPO Film Unit and others.
- Shorter works which use well-known tunes such as the cabaret song When you're feeling like expressing your affection, the ballad Around the Village Green and an unashamedly slushy setting of the Victorian favourite I dreamt that I dwelt in marble halls.
- Includes music from the longer films; Night Mail (including the famous Auden poem), The King's Stamp and The Way to the Sea.
- Supported by the Britten Estate, this recording is historically important and features a comprehensive booklet with photographs and film stills.
- The scores for this recording were specially reconstructed from manuscript and other sources held at the Britten-Pears Library, by composers Joseph Phibbs and Lloyd Moore under the supervision of Colin Matthews, Executive Producer of NMC and Director of the Britten-Pears Estate.
- The disc features a new performing edition of *The Way to the Sea* along with a premiere recording of *Coal Face* and the first recording of the complete music to *Night Mail*.
- Features Simon Russell Beale as narrator, who is currently enjoying the role of King Arthur in Monty Python's award-winning show, Spamalot.



- In Praise of Krishna is a setting of religious poems of the Bengali Vaishnava sect describing a young woman's love affair with the god Krishna; Blake responds to the powerful sensuality of the poems with an exotic and beautiful language of his own.
